Residence and Employment

On January 19, 1956, [redacted] of the apartment building located at 409 Edgecomb Avenue, New York City, advised SA [redacted] that the subject and her husband moved away from that address in about November, 1955. [redacted] stated that he was under the impression that they moved to Brooklyn, New York.

On January 20, 1956, [redacted] who was in a position to furnish reliable information, advised that the subject and her family, in November, 1955, ^{moved} from 409 Edgecomb Avenue, New York City, to 1268 President Street, Brooklyn, New York.

Also, on January 20, 1956, [redacted] who was in a position to furnish reliable information, confirmed that as of that date the PATTERSON's were residing at 1268 President Street, Brooklyn, New York.

On April 11, 1957, a pretext call by a Special Agent of the FBI to an individual at 1268 President Street, Brooklyn, New York, who identified herself as the daughter of the subject, revealed that the subject currently resides at that address and is employed. The nature of the subject's employment was not learned; however it was determined from this individual that the subject departs her residence at approximately 7:45 AM and returns at approximately 6:15 PM.

Miscellaneous Activity Indicating Sympathy with the Communist Party (CP)

On December 7, 1955, [redacted] who has furnished reliable information in the past, made available information which reflected that the subject and her husband were among the hosts of a farewell reception for CLAUDIA JONES which was scheduled to be held on that same date at the Hotel Theresa, Seventh Avenue and 125th Street, New York City.

The "Daily Worker," an East Coast Communist daily newspaper, in its issue of January 1, 1951, on page one and column one, reported that CLAUDIA JONES was Secretary of the National Women's Commission of the CP, United States of America .

JONES was convicted on January 21, 1953 the the United States District Court (USDC), Southern District of New York (SDNY), for violation of the Smith Act of 1940. She was sentenced to one year and one day in prison and fined \$2000.. JONES was released after completion of sentence at the Federal Reformatory for Women, Alderson, West Virginia, on October 23, 1955, and on December 9, 1955 she voluntarily departed from the United States under a warrant of deportation, destination Great Britain.

On March 10 and 15, 1956, [] who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the subject was present at the WILLIAM Z. FOSTER birthday celebration which was held at the Chateau Gardens, New York City, on March 9, 1956, to honor FOSTER.

The "Daily Worker," issue of February 13, 1957, page two, column four, disclosed the names of the members elected on February 12, 1957, as members of the new National Committee of the CP. Among those individuals listed were WILLIAM Z. FOSTER and JAMES E. JACKSON.

[] In regard to JAMES E. JACKSON, on March 15, 1956, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the subject and her husband were to have a party at their home on President Street in Brooklyn, New York, that same evening. The informant stated that several CP functionaries would be there and thought that JAMES E. JACKSON would be guest of honor.

On June 18, 1956 [] who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that LOUISE PATTERSON of Brooklyn, New York, was among those individuals invited to attend a Conference on the South scheduled to be held on June 30, 1956, at the Jefferson School of Social Science, New York City.

Regarding the Conference on the South, it is noted that on June 4, 1956, [] who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the CP, USA, had directed a bulletin "To all Districts" on June 1, 1956. This bulletin was signed by the National Organization Department and the National Negro Commission of the CP and describes an important

Conference on the South to be held at the Jefferson School on June 30, 1956. The bulletin states the Conference is in preparation for a book by Marxist authors and the chief aims of the project are:

- "A: To arm the progressive movement with a theoretical understanding of the south as a prime political question in the US.
- "B: To help influence and direct the tempo of the Democratic movement in and around the South.
- "C: To make some progress towards developing closer relations with non-Marxists who have deep interests in the Southern Question."

The CP bulletin urges East Coast districts prepare now for the attendance of selected individuals from their states and that where possible there be representatives from the Mid-West Districts.

The Jefferson School of Social Science, referred to above, has been designated by the Attorney General Of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

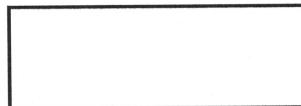

On January 22, 1958, a Special Agent (SA) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) made a pretext telephone call to INGERSOLL 7-1242, listed in the current Brooklyn, New York Telephone Directory to Mrs. LOUISE T. PATTERSON, 1268 President Street. The individual answering advised that Mrs. PATTERSON resided at that address but was not home at the time.

On March 31, 1958, an SA of the FBI observed that the subject continued to reside at the above-mentioned address.

Employment

Records of the Board of Elections, Borough of Brooklyn, City of New York, checked on May 28, 1957, by SA [redacted] reflected that in registering in 1956 from 1268 President Street, Brooklyn, New York, the subject listed her employment as bookkeeper at 210 West 50th Street, Manhattan, New York.

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Through a pretext telephone call, made by an SA of the FBI on June 28, 1957, to JUDSON 2-1890, listed to Local 1199, Retail Drug Employees Union, 210 West 50th Street, Manhattan, it was ascertained through the switchboard operator that the subject was then employed as a bookkeeper by that union.

On January 7, 1958, an SA of the FBI, through the medium of a pretext telephone call to JUDSON 2-1890, listed to the Retail, Wholesale and Drug Employees Union, Local 1199, 210 West 50th Street, Manhattan, New York, it was ascertained that the subject no longer was employed thereat.

[redacted] on April 1, 1958, advised that the subject, under the name of LOUISE THOMPSON, ~~was~~ then employed as an office worker by High Meadow West, Incorporated, which is concerned with the United Nations (UN) International Cooperative Community Project. [redacted] stated that the subject works at the UN Headquarters, East 42nd Street and First Avenue, New York, New York. According to [redacted] the subject's home address is 1268 President Street, Brooklyn, New York.

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II. CONNECTIONS WITH THE COMMUNIST MOVEMENT

The Communist Party (CP) has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

CP Membership

[redacted] on July 7, 1952, advised the following information, which he had learned at that time from a CP functionary who was in a position to know:

NY. *MEMBER*
The CP, USA has "gone crazy" on the matter of white chauvinism. An organization known as Sojourners for Truth and Justice was formed by the Party to combat white chauvinism. Leaders of this organization are CLAUDIA JONES and WILLIAM and LOUISE PATTERSON. JONES

and the PATTERSONS through this organization were viciously terrorizing the entire Party organization through threats and intimidation on matters of white chauvinism to the extent that, while they had no important Party titles, they carried great power in the Party leadership.

CP Sympathies

[] on October 25, 1956, advised that one LOUISE PATTERSON, New York City, was among those who recently sent birthday greetings to BETTY GANNETT at the Federal Reformatory, Alderson, West Virginia.

BETTY GANNETT was National Educational Director of the CP, USA and was convicted of violation of the Smith Act of 1940 on January 21, 1953, United States District Court, Southern District of New York. She was sentenced to two years imprisonment and fined \$4,000.00. GANNETT began serving her sentence on January 11, 1955, and was released on parole on September 10, 1956.

[] in July, 1957, furnished information identifying the subject entering or leaving 23 West 26th Street, New York, New York, on July 3, 1957. This address, according to [] is the Headquarters of National and New York State Offices of the CP.

[] on July 19, 1957, advised that the subject and her husband were among those present on Sunday afternoon, July 7, 1957, at the unveiling of a red granite memorial stone for the grave of "Mother" ELLA REEVE BLOOR at Harleigh Cemetery, Haddon Avenue and Crescent Boulevard, Camden, New Jersey.

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[redacted] on April 14, 1957, advised that WILLIAM L. PATTERSON, former Executive Secretary of the defunct Civil Rights Congress (CRC), was recently elected to the State Committee of the New York State CP.

The CRC has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The "Daily Worker" of June 20, 1947, page 5, columns 2 and 3, in an article captioned "CP Greet Mother Bloor, 85, As 'Forever Young'", stated in part that ELLA REEVE BLOOR was the "first lady of the CP and of the working class".

"The Worker" of August 12, 1951, page 2, column 1, reflects that ELLA REEVE BLOOR "known to generations of Americans as 'Mother Bloor', the world famed Communist woman leader", died on Friday, August 10, 1951.

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The "Daily Worker" was an East Coast Communist daily newspaper. It's last edition was published on January 13, 1958.

"The Worker" is a weekly Communist newspaper.

[redacted] on January 10, 1958, advised that he had learned on January 5, 1958, from a New York County CP official that the subject had been responsible for a "Freedom Ball" on New Year's Eve in Harlem, New York. It was indicated that, mostly through the efforts of the subject, the ball had been a huge success. Moreover, members of the New York County CP Committee sat at the table of honor, and the New York County CP contributed \$25.00 at the ball.

CP Fronts

[redacted] on March 11, 1952, provided a copy of the Spring, 1952, catalogue of the Frederick Douglas Educational Center (FDEC). One LOUISE PATTERSON is listed therein as a member of the Center's Committee.

The FDEC has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

CP Associates

[redacted] on July 16, 1957, advised that the subject and her husband attended a wedding reception for [redacted] and [redacted] on Sunday evening, July 14, 1957, at the home of [redacted] Manhattan, New York. The reception was a rather large one and was attended by many National and New York State CP functionaries.

The "Daily Worker", May 6, 1957, page 3, in an article captioned "New CP National Committee Reports On First Meeting", sets forth that at the full National Committee meeting of the CP held in New York City on April 27, and 28, 1957, a National Executive Committee of twenty was established. [redacted] was listed as among those elected to this committee.

[redacted] on July 29, 1957, made information available that the subject was then visiting at the home of [redacted] and [redacted] in the Woodstock, New York area.

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NY 100-24624

[redacted] on December 6, 1952, advised that [redacted] attended CP meetings in the Woodstock, New York area prior to 1946. On June 13, 1953, [redacted] advised that [redacted] and [redacted] recently returned from California, where they were allegedly active in CP affairs. [redacted] added that [redacted] was considered to be a "good organizer" and she would see that "study groups" were started for CP members in the Zena, New York area.

[redacted] advised on July 5, 1956, [redacted] spoke of herself as being a CP member and discussed the degrading of STALIN on July 2, 1956. She mentioned that STALIN made mistakes, that the Communists in Russia were still making mistakes but, at least, were trying to advance Socialism and, therefore, could not be condemned. [redacted] also stated that she hoped for more CP activity as soon as the "United States CP" get their plans set.

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Miscellaneous Activity

[redacted] on January 29, 1958, advised that he observed the subject at a social gathering on December 29, 1957, held at the Celebrity Club, New York City, under the auspices of the Edward E. Strong Memorial Educational Fund.

[redacted] on December 30, 1957, advised that LOUISE and WILLIAM PATTERSON on December 29, 1957, attended a benefit cabaret party for the Edward Strong Memorial Fund, held at 35 East 125th Street, New York, New York, the Celebrity Club. According to [redacted] the purpose of this affair was to raise funds for the education of ED STRONG's children.

EDWARD EUGENE STRONG, who, according to the records, Department of Health, City of New York, died April 9, 1957, was indicted on May 29, 1956, by the Federal Grand Jury, District of Massachusetts, Boston, Massachusetts, for violation of the Smith Act of 1940. STRONG was released on \$10,000.00 bail awaiting trial.

[redacted] advised on July 6, 1956, that [redacted] from [redacted] that as of two months previously ED STRONG was jointly in charge of CP organizational activities in the South.

[redacted] advised on March 11, 1956, that [redacted] was a member of the CP Organization Commission.

[redacted] advised in October, 1957, that on October 3, 1957, a Czechoslovakian Delegation to the UN held a reception of the type sponsored by each delegation to the UN during the session of the General Assembly of the UN.

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On October 3, 1957, SAS of the FBI observed that WILLIAM L. PATTERSON was picked up by his wife, the subject, in a 1948 or 1949 Buick, bearing 1957 New York State License 8K2882. This automobile proceeded to 6 East 67th Street, Manhattan, New York, the Czechoslovakian Mission to the UN, where both entered.

The records of the New York State Bureau of Motor Vehicles, checked on February 19, 1958, by SA [redacted] reflect that 1957 Registration Number 8K2882 covering a 1950 Buick sedan, Engine Number 5950805, was issued to LOUISE THOMPSON PATTERSON, 1268 President Street, Brooklyn, New York.

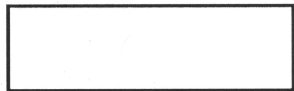

II. CONNECTIONS WITH THE COMMUNIST PARTY (CP)

The CP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

A. CP Activities

[redacted] on October 6, 1951, stated he had learned within the past month from a CP functionary, that WILLIAM PATTERSON was going underground and that his wife, LOUISE, wanted to go underground with him. Accordingly, LOUISE was trying to find someone to take care of her eight year old daughter. [redacted] related that the CP had other plans for LOUISE PATTERSON. The Party wanted LOUISE PATTERSON to tour the United States with the widows of lynch victims so as to arouse the sympathy of the Negro people throughout the country.

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On April 14, 1957, [redacted] stated that WILLIAM L. PATTERSON had recently been elected to the State Committee of the New York State CP.

On February 3, 1958, [redacted] advised that according to a New York State CP official, the New York State CP Committee and the National Executive Committee of the CP had approved a list of functionaries for "The Worker." Included on this list was WILLIAM PATTERSON, General Manager.

"The Worker" is an East Coast Communist weekly newspaper.

B. CP Associates

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On January 7, 1958, a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), made a pretext telephone call to the former residence of [redacted] and was advised by an unidentified female that [redacted] could be reached [redacted] by calling INGERSOL 7-1242.
