



RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

"The Southern Patriot," official publication of the Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc. (SCEF), issue of April, 1954, on page 4, published an article under the caption "Negro Leaders Send Protest to Jenner." The article reported that thirty-three Negro leaders from fifteen Southern states and the District of Columbia sent an open letter to Senator WILLIAM E. JENNER condemning his attack on the Southern Conference Educational Fund as "an attack upon the Negro community of this Nation." Among the signers was listed "E. FRANKLIN FRAZIER, Washington, D. C."

The March 11, 1954, issue of the "New Orleans Times-Picayune," under the caption "Seven Subpoenaed in Probe of Southern Organization," published a list of officers and members of the Board of Directors of the SCEF as furnished by JAMES A. DOMBROWSKI, Executive Director of the Fund. Among the members of the Board of Directors was listed "E. FRANKLIN FRAZIER, Professor of Sociology, Howard University, Washington, D. C."

letterhead of the SCEF on August 11, 1954. On the reverse side of the letterhead was printed the names of the officers and members of the Board of Directors of the SCEF. Under the heading "Board of Directors," was listed "Dr. E. FRANKLIN FRAZIER, Washington, D. C."

On August 18, 1955, provided a letterhead of the SCEF, the reverse side of which contained a list of the officers and members of the Board of Directors. "Dr. E. FRANKLIN FRAZIER, Washington, D. C.," was named as a member of the Board of Directors.

On April 3, 1957, ______ made available a letter-head of the SCEF which set forth on the reversedside the names of the officers and members of the Board of Directors of the SCEF. Under the heading "Board of Directors," in the city of Washington, D. C., was the name "Dr. E. FRANKLIN FRAZIER."
