Reference is made to Federal Bureau of Investigation memorandum captioned as above and dated February 12, 1971.

The March 23, 1971 issue of the "Daily World", an east coast communist newspaper, contains an article on page three captioned, "EUROPEANS STEP UP DRIVE TO AID ANGELA DAVIS FIGHT".

According to above article, Mrs. Louise Patterson, executive secretary of the New York Committee To Free Angela Davis (NY OTFAD), returned to the United States about March 9, 1971 after a weeks tour of Great Britain's chief industrial cities, Manchester, Birmingham, Leeds, Coventry, Edinburgh and Glasgow where she addressed citywide rallies, participated in marches and demonstrations at U.S. consulates and was interviewed by television and newspaper reporters. She spoke at London's Royal Festival Hall on February 28, 1971 and travelled to France about March 8, 1971 where she met with Mme. Marie Vaillant-Coutourier, Communist member of the National Assembly. Mrs. Patterson stated that wherever she went the audiences grasped the basic issues of racism and repression in the Davis matter and they pledged to form local committees to work for the freedom of Angela Davis.

NEW YORK COMMITTEE TO FREE ANGELA DAVIS

ANGELA DAVIS was apprehended in New York City on October 13, 1970, for Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution in the State of California. A warrant had been issued charging her with kidnapping and murder. DAVIS is a self-admitted Communist Party (CP) member who had been a teacher at the University of California at Los Angeles.

A confidential source advised on October 16, 1970, that the National Office of the CP of the United States of America (USA) is setting up a defense committee for ANGELA DAVIS. JAMES TORMEY who is in charge of the Defense Committee CP, USA, is responsible for this task.

The "Daily World", an east coast communist newspaper, issue of October 24, 1970, carried an article which stated "The New York Committee to Free Angela Davis" was formed October 23, 1970, and JOSE STEVENS, described as "the Harlem Organizer of the Communist Party" was elected chairman of the committee.

The "Daily World" issue of October 30, 1970, carried an advertisement stating the New York Committee to Free Angela Davis is located at 29 West 15th Street, 7th floor, New York City.

A confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised on March 25, 1971 that an unidentified briefcase containing papers of a suspicious nature had been turned over to the Lost and Found Department of a New York City agency.

Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation examined above briefcase on March 25, 1971, and photographs were made of pertinent material contained therein. briefcase and its contents were then returned to above department for whatever disposition they deemed necessary.

Above briefcase contained a two page itinerary for Mrs. Louise Patterson concerning her travel in Great Britain and listing her anticipated presence in the following cities:

The following information was furnished by [confidential sources abroad] between February 9 and March 19,

According to the sources, surprisingly little public interest has been manifested in the ANGELA YVONNE DAVIS case by either the French Communist Party (PCF) or local organizations supporting the Black Power Movement. initial indications that the communist-dominated French General Confederation of Labor (CGT) would support a World Syndicalist Federation appeal calling for freeing DAVIS portended a vigorous pro-DAVIS campaign, no such activity has developed Even the usually hyperbolic PCF newspaper "L'Humanite" to date. has been relatively moderate in its treatment of the issue in the scanty coverage which it has afforded to the DAVIS trial. which it described in typically doctrinaire fashion as "racist" motivated. Sources indicated, however, that preoccupation with issues having greater local appeal, such as students imprisoned by the French police and concern with the organization of a right-wing political group which has already clashed with PCF militants, together with preparations for recently-concluded local elections diminished pro-DAVIS activities which might otherwise have been held.

Concerning the apparent nonconcern of Black Power organizations, the sources indicated the recent split within the Black Panther Party in the United States has resulted in a struggle for control among elements which are committed respectively to ELDRIDGE CLEAVER and the Algiers-based faction and to HUEY NEWTON. All other issues, including DAVIS, are currently being held in abeyance pending the outcome of the power struggle between European supporters of the above-named Panther luminaries. The sources further noted that DAVIS is considered primarily as a communist rather than a Black Power personality in view of her basically political rather than racial orientation.

It is to be noted that although E. LOUISE PATTERSON, wife of Communist Party, USA functionary (WILLIAM L& PATTERSON, who heads the New York Committee to Free ANGELA DAVIS was scheduled to travel to Paris from England on March 9, 1971, for the purpose of engaging in pro-DAVIS activities, no information

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is currently available to sources which would indicate there has been any such activity to date. PATTERSON reportedly made numerous speeches in London on the DAVIS case and was highly active during her stay in England.

When Louise Patterson arrived in Eur-ope last months on behalf of the campaign to free Angela Davis she carfried with her a good-sized package of literature on the case But, more important, she brought with her a wide knowledge of the racist nature of United States justice, gained in long years of experience as a Black community activist Now she is the executive secretary of the New York Committee to

Her hectic stay, in Europe included. a ten-day whirlwind speaking tour of Britain's leading cities London, Manchester, Leeds, Birmingham, Coventry, Edinburgh, Glasgow, and Cardiff in Wales, and a two-day trip to France for consultation with several leaders in the French movement to free Angela Davis Sandwiched into the speaking tour was a conference in London on plans for a national British committee of support - " F , 3" for Angela

On a visit to our office a few days fter her return, Mrs Patterson emphasized the strong support for Angela by the British labor movement She read a clip from the Morning Star about a rally "The audience included trade unionists from every trade and profes-

In Paris, Marie Claude Vaillant-Coutourier, Communist deputy in the National Assembly, reported on a group of prominent. French women who had cabled Governor Rockefeller at the time of the fight against Angela's extradition last fall Now these women are again joining to demand the safeguarding of Angela's legal rights in her trial in Marin County, California.

While in France her hosts also told her of a Feb 17 rally there, followed by a mass march to the US embassy, sponsored by ahe French Communist Party, the French Association of Democratic Lawyers, the General Confederation of Labor (CGT), and the Human Rights League

Crowded into her Paris stay was an extended interview by L'Humanite, then an interview with the editor of a leading women's magazine of the CGT and. a conference with Raymond Guyot, secretary of the International department of the Communist Party, followed by a day-long conference with Prof Jacques Hily of the University of Nancy Hily is heading up a national Angela Davis committee now being organized of leaders in various fields

Then Joe Normand, secretary of the International Association of Jurists, told her of legal scholars and jurists from countries of Asia; Africa and Latin America, as well as Europe, who may cross the Atlantic to register in person their distress and concern over the persecution and imprisonment of Angela Davis

Dear Comrades

Of the innumerable messages of support and solidarity I have received from abroad, the most impressive have been the tens of thousands of letters from the GDR The letters and especially the drawings from the school children of your country attest to the truth of Jose Marti's comment on youth "Los ninos son la esperanza del mindo" You have given me and my captive comrades a tremendous reservoir of strength and courage Haying experienced the most formidable eruption of fascism yourselves, you, more than anyone, are are of the dangers we face in the U S A

The savage aggression against the peoples of Indochina is reflected inside our country by the growing suppression of revolutionaries As larger sections of the pression of revolutionaries As larger sections of the Black, Chicano and Puerto Rican communities attain higher levels of political maturity, and follow, in the tradition of such great men as Paul Robeson and W E B. DuBois by refusing to acquiesce in the government's monstrous deeds, we become the targets of ever-increasing official repression

Behind the walls of America's prisons - key instruments, along with the judicial system, in carrying out that repression — political consciousness is developing at an accelerated pace Prisoners, from 30% to 50% of whom are Black and Brown in the major cities across this country, are swiftly realizing that their individual 'criminal' acts are inadequate responses to a complex system of monopoly capitalism and that, therefore, they must involve themselves in a collective movement for liberation The works of Marx, Engels, Lenin, and other revolutionaries are smuggled into prisons and radical political groupings have been

formed in virtually every major penal institution

There can be no doubt that the blatantly totalitarian
structure of the prison renders it by far the most hazardous terrain for struggle Yet, despite the perils, many of our brothers and sisters have continued to courageously educate and enlighten their imprisoned companions George Jackson, for example, who has long been a Marxist-Leninist, did not permit his indeterminate sentence of one year to life (for an alleged robbery, involving \$70) to deter him from his political tasks. As a direct consequence of the political tasks. tasks As a direct consequence of his politics, he has already spent eleven years in prison for a crime which

usually brings two and a half years at the very most
Last, year, he and two other Black activists, Fleeta
Drumgo and John Clutchette, were framed by the prison authorities on a charge involving the killing of a Soledad prison guard The State of California intends to kill these three men-the Soledad Brothers-in an attempt

these three men—the Soledad Brothers—in an attempt to terrorize thousands of political activists in Califorina's prison population as well as our broader liberation movement and Black people in general transportation movement and support the state of t

in the prisons Jonathan, James McClain and Williams Christmas lost their lives in an heroic attempt to com pel the people of this country to look through the con-crete walls and iron bars of California's prisons and to begin to demand changes

Because of my efforts to build a mass movement around the issue of prison repression, the August 7 in surrection was seized upon as an excuse to surject to charge me with three capital offenses I will soc ind trial for my life together with Ruchell Magee, the sole survivor of the insurrection

Ruchell Magee's previous experiences with the courts and prisons, extending over fifteen years of his life, are a classic example of the victimization and suppression of Blacks under the guise of justice. His original conviction brought him life imprisonment of

original conviction prought nim life imprisonment on, charge involving an alleged \$10 robbery .


GERMAN FEDERAL REPUBLIC (WEST GERMANY)
