WILLIAM GARDNER SMITH was issued passport Z 687009 on 7/25/67 at Paris, France. According to a notice published in the Federal Register on 2/16/67 this passport was valid for a period of 3 years for travel to all countries except Cuba, Mainland China, North Korea and North Vietnam.

In his application for this passport dated 7/24/67 at Paris, France, SMITH indicated he was born 2/6/27 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and listed his permanent residence as 35 rue Geoffrey Street, Helaire, Paris 5, France. He stated in this application that his parents were WILLIAM SMITH, born Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, 1900 "(?)", now deceased and BERTHA EDITH SMITH, nee SMITH born Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, 1909 "(?)", now residing in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He stated that both parents were United States citizens. SMITH indicated under his travel plans that he intended to remain abroad "indefinitely". <u>He further indicated that he was last</u> Jon 10/31/61 at Paris, France married to___ and that she was not a United States citizen havengbeen born 11/13/36 in Paris, France.

SMITH's file revealed that a previous passport Z136168 which had been issued 7/9/62 in Paris, France had been cancelled. A review of the application for this passport which was dated 7/9/62 at Paris, France revealed the following information which did not appear on the subject's 7/24/67 application.

He listed his permanent address at that time as 1330 South And the med 20th Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and his resident address as 1 rue de Tournon, Paris 6, France. SMITH gave and listed his

mother's birth date as 3/26/10 and her residence as 1330 South 20th Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He indicated his mother, Mrs. EDITH EARLE, should be notified at the 20th Street address in the event of death or accident.

Subject's passport file disclosed the following telegram stamped "Limited Official Use", dated 8/8/67 from the American Embassy, Niamey, Republic of Niger which was sent to 8 other American Embassies in that part of the world and to the USDS, Washington, D. C.

"For past ten days the local newspaper has been running daily installments of series of articles by AFP (Agence France Presse), Special Correspondent, WILLIAM current riots, agitation and Negro problems in GARDNER SMITH said to be American Negro journalist and novelist living for past 15 years in Paris. Local press picking up this series verbatim from AFP ticker service. These stories, coupled with dramatic photos of recent disturbances, are certain to be read by anyone picking up the daily newspaper. While last few day's installments plus those yet to come may moderate the exaggerations of the first several articles in series, overall result quite likely to be damaging to general image in Niger. Following impression will probably remain salient in most readers minds: Bulk of American Negroes share CARMICHAEL and BROWN thesis that Negroes no longer consider themselves Americans, reject Viet-Nam war effort, and enthusiastically embrace violence as only vague solution their economic and social problems.

"We are watching these articles carefully in effort determine how best counter the effect we fear. Meanwhile, would be helpful to us and doubtless of interest Department to know whether these articles being picked up by your local press. We have not noted any radio references as yet."

Subject's passport file as reviewed above and the records of the office of Security. USDS, which were reviewed on 2/14/68 by SA did not reflect any information pertaining to SMITH's contacts or activities other than the 8/8/67 telegram set forth above.

Regarding Philadelphia's request in referenced airtel for WFO to review visa records regarding SMITH and it is pointed out that the USDS does not have visa records for native born United States citizens such as SMITH. WFO is presently awaiting the results of a visa record check on subject's and will furnish this information to the Bureau and Philadelphia when obtained.

It is also noted that by Bureau routing slip dated 2/9/68 Philadelphia is being requested to place appropriate stops at the local United States Customs office therefore WFO will take no further action regarding this lead.

On 4/17/64, an anonymous source advised that the name and address of WILLIAM GARDNER SMITH was contained in the records located on the 9th floor, 832 Broadway, New York City, occupied by the New Centry Publishers, Political Affairs, and Masses and Mainstream.

> New Centry Publishers has been identified by JOHN LAUTNER, former CP functionary, as being the pamphlet publishing house of the CP, USA. He also advised that "Political Affairs" is the theoretical organ of the CP, USA, while "Masses and Mainstream" is the cultural organ.



WILLIAM GARDNER SMITH

The following information was received on February 28, 1968, from the Regional Security Office, American Embassy, Paris, France, which was obtained by them from a check of French Police records:

WILLIAM GARDNER SMITH, born February 6, 1927 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, son of WILLIAM and BERTHE SMITH, entered France via Le Havre on October 19, 1951. He held United States Passport #511657, issued in Washington on September 27, 1951. On arrival in France, he stated he was about to be divorced from an American, residing in the United States. He quickly cohabited with a Frenchwoman

Tournon, Paris 6, from 1952 to 1954, and at 34 rue de Moscou, Paris 8, from 1954 to 1956.

SMITH has always abided by administrative regulations in France as applied to aliens. He was a journalist and held a French Foreign Journalist Permit. Speaking French and English fluently, he worked with the Agence France Presse during 1954 as a writer-translator. He also did translation work for various French magazines.

SMITH moved to 93 rue Belliard, Paris 18, on September 2, 1958, and on January 28, 1960, to 47 rue Mouffetard, Paris 5. On March 6, 1963, he was reported as residing at 12 rue du Cherche Midi, and finally on November 7, 1966, when issued his last French Resident Permit (Privileged Resident Permit #AA-42161, valid through July 9, 1976), he stated he was residing at 35 rue Geoffroy Saint Hilaire.

SMITH, in the meanwhile, had obtained his divorce in the United States, although no date is mentioned in the records, and he was married on October 31, 1962, in Paris 6, to a

As SMITH was a journalist continuously residing in France (and who is a Negro), various routine police checks have been made concerning him politically. According to a report of the Direction de la Surveillance du Territoire (French domestic counterespionage service), Paris, he is said to have been known in the United States as a communist sympathizer during 1948.

The Paris American Committee to Stopwar, whose honorary recently named SMITH as replacement of Vice President who returned to the United States. It appears that he was chosen on account of his profession on the one hand, for his political opinions which he does not hide and which he expressed at a meeting held at the Quaker Organization premises, 113 rue de Vaugirard, Paris, and also because of his race and its problems in the United States at the present time.

The General Intelligence Section of the Paris Police suspects SMITH of having contacts with "Black Power."

Notices were posted in prominent places in American organizations in Paris advertising a round-table discussion to be held on February 29, 1968, at 9:00 PM, at the American Students and Artists Center, 261 Boulevard Raspail, Paris, regarding "Black Power" and "Black Revolution." It was indicated that WILLIAM GARDNER SMITH would be the principal speaker.

Subject stated the situation in the States is not nearly as serious as that reported in the French press and he felt much progress had been made by the Negro. While in the states, subject would report to the office in New York City and he would then travel to the various cities to cover the racial situations. He spent several days in Philadelphia visiting his family. Subject never discussed his complete itinerary, but he did indicate he was in Detroit and Chicago. Also, he would always report to the New York Office to submit his articles.

Mrs. EARLE stated that although subject appeared to be doing well in Paris, he did not possess any wealth and he did not indicate he had access to any great amount of funds. Mrs. EARLE had no knowledge that subject associated with any groups.

CHARACTERIZATIONS OF ORGANIZATIONS

AMERICAN INSTITUTE FOR MARXIST STUDIES (AIMS)

A source advised on April 9, 1963, that on April 7, 1963, at a meeting of the District Committee of the Communist Party (CP) of New England, held in Boston, Massachusetts, HERBERT APTHEKER stated he was developing an organization called American Institute for Marxist Studies (AIMS) which would eventually legalize the CP. He stated AIMS would publish literature on History, Science, Physics, Archeology, and other subjects which would be put out quarterly with various supplements. U

A second source advised on June 30, 1966, that HERBERT APTHEKER was elected to the National Committee, CPUSA, at the 18th National Convention of the CPUSA held June 22 - 26, 1966, in New York City.

A third source advised on June 7, 1963, that on June 3, 1963, HERBERT APTHEKER spoke at the CP of New York District Board meeting concerning AIMS. APTHEKER stated AIMS would unite and strengthen the CP although the CP would not be connected with it. He stated AIMS was being formed within the scope of the Mc Carran and Smith Acts and would legally bring Marxist material and opinions to the attention of American scholars and the general public.

A fourth source reported on August 29, 1966, that AIMS issues a "Newsletter" every other month. This source also made available the information that AIMS issues publications and holds symposiums concerning Marxism.

A fifth source advised on May 9, 1967, that as of that date, AIMS was located at 20 East 30th Street, New York City.

FREEDOMWAYS ASSOCIATES, INC.

The records of the New York State Secretary of State, Albany, New York, show that the Certificate of Incorporation of Freedomways Associates, Inc., was filed on March 2, 1961.

On May 24, 1961, a source advised that a report was given on "Freedomways" at a meeting of the National Board, Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), held on May 24, 1961. It was stated that the central purpose of "Freedomways" is to develop a theory and positive criticism of currents in the Negro Movement, as well as to raise the level of understanding and discussion taking place in Negro life today and to project a socialist and pro-Soviet orientation.

On May 25, 1961, a second source advised that "Freedomways" was set up for the CPUSA by JAMES JACKSON.

The First Quarter, 1967, issue of "Freedomways," self-described as "A Quarterly Review of the Negro Freedom Movement" published by Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, 799 Broadway, New York City, lists the following as its editorial staff:

STUDENT NONVIOLENT COORDINATING COMMITTEE

Literature distributed by the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), headquartered at 360-362 Nelson Street, S. W., Atlanta, Georgia, describes itself as not being a membership organization, but rather an agency attempting to stimulate and foster the growth of local protest movements. SNCC was born out of the sit-in movement which crupted across the South beginning on February 1, 1960. A conference at Raleigh, North Carolina, that Spring, brought together many of the demonstrating Southern students in a loose network of militant youth which was officially named SNCC in October, 1960.

A source has advised that in May, 1966, Stokely Carmichael was elected National Chairman by the Central Committee. In May, 1967 Carmichael was replaced as Chairman by H. Rap Brown, with Carmichael assuming the position of Recruiter and Organizer for the SNCC. In August. 1967, at the invitation of Fidel Castro, Carmichael participated in the Organization of Latin American Solidarity Conference which was held in Havana, Cuba. Subsequent thersto, Carmichael traveled to Hanoi and other sections of North Vietnam. He returned to the United States in December, 1967, at which time his passport was picked up because of travel to unauthorized countries.

A source advised that when Carmichael was elected Chairman of SNCC, the organization embarked on a program of eliminating Caucasians from its ranks. With the election of H. Rap Brown as Chairman in 1967, it embarked on a world-wise struggle for human rights and to take a firm stand against violations of these rights by the American Government and to strengthen its programs of opposition to the draft and to the United States involvement in Vietnam.

Literature distributed in February, 1968, identifies SNCC as an organization in the revolutionary vanguard. It advocates that to be successful it is necessary to develop a revolutionary ideology and revolutionary program.

On August 13, 1967, while addressing a group in the Watts area of Los Angeles, California, H. Rap Brown said "You better shape up America, or we'll burn you down." Later in February, 1968, in a publicized note Brown wrote, "America, i% it takes my death to organize my people to revolt against you and to organize your jails to revolt against you and to organize your children, your God, your poor, your country, and to organize mankind to rejoice in your destruction and ruin, then here's my life."



Sources, all who have furnished reliable information in the past, contacted during July, 1968, advised that they are not acquainted with and have no information regarding any activities on the part of William Gardner Smith in Chicago, Illinois, during the summer of 1967.
