EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute(A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;

- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could be reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could be reasonably expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

A loyalty form has been received concerning the employee, six copies of which are being transmitted herewith. A full field investigation is being initiated by this Bureau concerning captioned employee pursuant to Executive Order 10422.

Files of this Bureau reflect that the Washington Bookshop Association sponsored a symposium in Washington, D. C., on 11-17-44, and that Franklin Frazier was moderator at this meeting. The Washington Bookshop Association has been cited by the Attorney General under Executive Order 10430.

It is to be noted that under item eighteen on the employee's Identification and Personnel Data Form he indicates membership in the Council on African Affairs. This organization has been cited by the Attorney General under Executive Order 10450. He also indicates membership in the Southern

Conference Educational Fund, Incorporated. This organization is an affiliate of the Southern Conference for Human Welfare. The Southern Conference for Human Welfare has been cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities. It is further noted that the employee lists that he is at the present time Vice-President of the Council of Arts, Science and Professions in New York City. It is possible that the employee is here referring to the National Council of the Arts, Sciences and Professions, which has been cited as a Communist front by the Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities or one of the National Council's affiliates or subdivisions. The employee also lists that he was a Board Member of the Committee for Far Eastern Democratic Policy. It is possible that the employee refers to the Committee for a Democratic Far Eastern Policy which has been designated by the Attorney General under Executive Order 10450.

It is noted that Frazier indicates on his Identification and Personnel Data Form that from 1940 to 1941 he was in Rio de Janeiro, Sao Paulo, Bahia, Trinidad and Haiti. In 1949, he indicates that he visited in Jamaica, Haiti, and Puerto Rico. He indicates that he has resided in Paris since 1950. It is also noted that his wife is residing with him in Paris at the present time. Since December, 1951, he has been employed by the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization. Under item fourteen of his Identification and Personnel Data Form he indicates that he has travelled extensively in Central America, South America, and Europe.

In this connection it would be appreciated if you would have the necessary investigation conducted abroad. It would also be appreciated if seven copies of your report could be received to facilitate the handling of this case by this Bureau. In the event that substantive disloyal information is developed, it is suggested that such information be obtained in the form of a signed statement if possible.

This is being submitted for your confidential information and should not be disseminated to unauthorized persons or agencies.

On page five of this report E. Franklin Frazier, 220 Rhode Island Avenue, is listed as having attended a 1940 Socialist Party Convention. (61-626-198x1)

Further reference is made to the report of SA [redacted], Washington, D. C., dated 11-11-43, entitled "Communist Infiltration of American Federation of Teachers (AFOL), Internal Security - C," WFO file 100-11101. On page eight of this report Edward Franklin Frazier is listed on the active indices of the American Peace Mobilization; Washington Committee for Democratic Action; Capitol City Forum; and the United American Spanish Relief Committee, (61-7546-147)

Further reference is made to the report of SA [redacted] New York City, dated 3-31-43, entitled "March on Washington Movement, Internal Security," New York file 100-26792. On page eleven of this report information is set out that Communists under the leadership of E. Franklin Frazier, tried to crash a meeting of the Fair Employment Practice Committee (FEPC) held on January 27, 1943, at the YMCA in New York City. (100-95014-234)

Reference is made to the report of SA [redacted] Washington, D. C., dated 12-20-44, captioned "Foreign Inspired Agitation Among the American Negroes in the Washington Field Division, Internal Security," WFO file 100-8878. On page fourteen of this report information is set out that the Washington Bookshop Association sponsored a symposium in Washington on 11-17-44, and that Franklin Frazier was moderator at the meeting. (100-135-53-185)

Reference is made to the report of SA [redacted] Washington, D. C., dated November 13, 1952, entitled "Emergency Civil Liberties Committee, Internal Security - C," WFO file 100-26294. On pages fifteen through eighteen of this report, a summary of E. F. Frazier's subversive activities are set out. (100-384660-16)

The "Daily Worker" for 7-18-49, page two, contained an article headed "Non-Partisan Committee Being Formed in Defense of the Twelve." This Non-Partisan Committee was to be formed in order to defend the rights of the twelve Communist leaders on trial. Included among the Committee was E. Franklin Frazier, Professor at Howard University. (100-3-74-A)

Reference is made to the report of SA [redacted] Washington, D. C., dated 3-31-45, entitled "The Washington Bookshop Association, Internal Security - C," WFO file 100-1618. On page seven of this report, the employee is listed as a member of the Washington Bookshop Association. (100-24699-87)

Further reference is made to the report of SA [redacted] New York, dated 9-30-46, entitled "Communist Infiltration of the National Council of Scientific Art, Professional and White Color Organizations, Internal Security - C," New York file 100-80576. On page twelve of this report a summary of the employee's subversive activities is set out. This summary includes his attendance at a meeting of the National Council of American Soviet Friendship. (100-342704-4)

Reference is made to the report of SA [redacted], Chicago, dated 3-15-45, entitled "Foreign Inspired Agitation Among the American Negroes in the Chicago Field Division, Internal Security," Chicago file 100-8458. On page three of this report information is set out that the employee was the principal speaker at a mass meeting of the Negro History Week in Chicago on 2-18-45, and that a large number of sponsors of the Negro History Week were either CPA members or were connected in some way with CPA front groups. (100-135-9-141)

Reference is made to New York letter to the Bureau dated June 7, 1950, entitled "National Council for American Education; Information Concerning," New York file 100-91459. This letter contained as an enclosure a dossier entitled "Red-Ucators at Columbia University." On page three of this dossier the employee's affiliation with Communist front organizations is set out. (62-87760-29)

Reference is further made to the report of SA [redacted] dated February 5, 1951, at Washington, D. C., entitled "National Council of Arts, Sciences and Professions, Incorporated; Internal Security - C, Internal Security Act, 1950," which contains pertinent information concerning Edward Franklin Frazier.

According to the report dated June 28, 1950, of the Hearings before a Subcommittee of the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations, the "Daily Worker" published an open letter on 4-16-47, calling upon Congress to defeat the various "exceptional and punitive measures directed against the Communist Party," which was in the hands of the House Committee on Un-American Activities. The letter further stated "the Communist Party is a legal American Political Party. We see nothing in its program, record or activities, either in war or peace, to justify the enactment of the repressive legislation now being urged upon the Congress in an atmosphere of an organized hysteria." Among the signers of this letter was E. Franklin Frazier, Howard University. (101-1603-11)

In an article published by the "Daily Worker" in its issue of October 31, 1950, the employee was listed as a sponsor of a conference to be held on Armistice Day, November 11, 1950, in New York City, to plan action urging the United States recognition of the Peiping Government and its admittance to the United Nations. (100-3-80-A)

The "Daily Worker" is an east coast Communist Party newspaper.

The Washington Bookshop Association has been cited by the Attorney General under Executive Order 10450.

The WFO should thoroughly review their files 101-1403 and 65-3956 concerning captioned employee and set out all pertinent information therein.

All offices should note that under item eighteen of the employee's Identification and Personnel Data Form he indicates that he was at one time Board Member of the Council on African Affairs which has been cited by the Attorney General under Executive Order 10450.

It should be noted also that the employee indicates membership in the Southern Conference Educational Fund, Incorporated, New Orleans, Louisiana. This organization is an affiliate of the Southern Conference for Human Welfare. The Southern Conference for Human Welfare has been cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities.

It is further noted that the employee lists that he is at the present time Vice-President of the Council of Arts, Science and Professions in New York City. It is possible that the employee is here referring to the National Council of the Arts, Sciences and Professions, which has been cited as a Communist front by the Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities as one of the National Council's affiliates or subdivisions. The employee also lists that he was a Board Member of the Committee for Far Eastern Democratic Policy. It is possible that the employee refers to the Committee for a Democratic Far Eastern Policy which has been designated by the Attorney General under Executive Order 10450.

WFO will set out the personal history, and in setting out the basis for this investigation in its report will correctly indicate therein that this investigation is being conducted pursuant to Executive Order 10450. WFO, in addition to making the usual agency checks, will also check records of CIA for any information they might have concerning the employee's wife, Marie Brown Frazier, who is residing in Paris, France, with him at the present time. The State Department is being requested to conduct necessary foreign investigation.

In the conduct of investigations of this type, you should refer to Bureau Bulletin 53-2, dated January 24, 1953. Your investigation should cover the employee's character, reputation, and associates as well as his loyalty. Office indices, credit and criminal, should also be checked concerning his relatives and the results incorporated in your report. The original and seven copies of your report are to be forwarded to the Bureau and the notation "Refer to Employees Security Section" should appear at the top of each original piece of correspondence. This case is to be assigned.

to mature and experienced agents thoroughly familiar with Loyalty and applicant-type investigations, and care should be taken to avoid any adverse criticism of the Bureau in the handling of this important program. This case is to be assigned immediately and Buded must be met without fail.

Note: Files 100-211255 and 100-64700 were not reviewed inasmuch as efforts to locate them prior to dictation were unsuccessful. These two files should be reviewed before this case is closed.

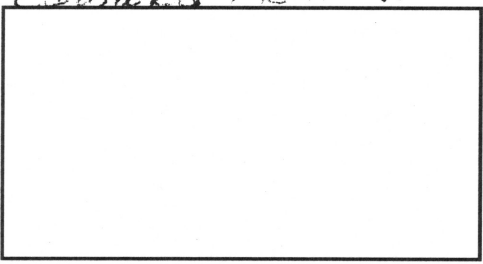

AT LAWRENCEVILLE, VIRGINIA:

b7c [redacted] Registrar, St. Paul's Normal and Industrial School, advised that his records for the years 1916, 1917 and 1918 are incomplete and fail to reflect the employment of the employee as a professor at the institution during 1917 and 1918. However, he stated that J. L. WHITEHEAD, Treasurer of the institution, and J. ALVIN RUSSELL, Past President, were associated with the school at that time and would in all possibility recall EDWARD FRANKLIN FRAZIER.

J. ALVIN RUSSELL, Past President, St. Paul's Normal and Industrial School, advised that he recalled the employee as a professor of English and History at St. Paul's during 1917 and 1918, while he, RUSSELL, was president of the school. He considered the employee as an industrious student of brilliant mind. He stated that he had not seen the employee for a number of years, but based on his former association with him he would state the employee was a man of excellent moral character, dependable, honest and a loyal American citizen.

J. L. WHITEHEAD, Treasurer of St. Paul's Normal and Industrial School, stated that the employee had been professor of English and History at St. Paul's Normal and Industrial School during 1917 and 1918 and had been known by him as a close friend and associate. He stated that EDWARD FRANKLIN FRAZIER was a very intelligent man, honest, dependable, of excellent moral character and a loyal American. He has met the employee on several occasions since he left St. Paul's and he continues to consider him a close friend. He stated that FRAZIER has continued to advance in the teaching profession and was considered by all who knew him as an outstanding student and teacher.

F. A. PATTERSON, bookkeeper, St. Paul's Normal and Industrial School, advised that he had been a student under EDWARD FRANKLIN FRAZIER during 1917 and 1918. He stated that he had not seen the employee since that time, but while FRAZIER was a professor at St. Paul's, he appeared to be a man of brilliant mind, honest, dependable, of good moral character, and a loyal American citizen.

III. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

Dr. HERBERT G. BLUMER, Chairman of the Department of Sociology and Social Institute, University of California, advised that he has known Dr. FRAZIER since about the summer of 1925 when both were graduate students in the Department of Sociology at the University of Chicago. He stated that they took their doctorate degree and entered academic work about the same time and correspond with each other and see each other two or three times a year at professional meetings. Dr. BLUMER went on to say that he believes he has a good picture of the employee and that he knew him well in non-academic work about 1931 or 1932. He stated that since that time, his personal contacts have been somewhat limited because of the nature and location of their work.

Dr. BLUMER advised that the employee's reputation, on a professional basis, is of the highest order, he being one of the foremost sociologists of his race in the world. He further advised that Dr. FRAZIER is the only person of his race to be President of the American Sociological Society which has been in existence since 1895. Dr. BLUMER went on to say that he can state quite forcibly that from the standpoint of the employee's character and reputation, he is recognized as honest, forthright, cooperative, honorable and a man of good sober judgment, bordering on the limits of great caution. He stated that Dr. FRAZIER is quite respected in terms of his thinking, has a disciplined mind and the disciplined character that goes with it.

According to Dr. BLUMER, in all of his associations with the employee, he cannot think of anything which would suggest disloyalty to our government or our way of life, nor does he recall any association with individuals or organizations on the part of Dr. FRAZIER that he (BLUMER) would think of as subversive in any sense. Dr. BLUMER went on to say that in Dr. FRAZIER's era, after World War I, there was an easy tendency for young
