1. Subject resides at 12651 Old Mill Place, Detroit, Michigan. He is employed as a librarian, Wayne County Public Library, 33030 Van Born Road, Wayne, Michigan. He is a Negro, born 1/14/14, Washington, D.C., a United States citizen. Inasmuch as he recently traveled abroad for a period of several weeks, he apparently is in good health.

Interview should be conducted to determine if any efforts were made to compromise or recruit subject. There are no known reasons why subject should not be interviewed.

Traffic Court records, Detroit, show that subject, born 1/14/14, Negro, 165 pounds, 5'8", during the period 3/24/57 to 1/13/64, received 18 traffic citations, primarily of a parking nature. The records of the Identification Bureau, Detroit Police Department, disclosed that DUDLEY F. RANDALL, Detroit Police Department #67013, was arrested 5/16/42 on a charge of murder. This individual, at the time of his arrest, was described as 28 years old, 5'8½", 148 pounds, medium brown complexion, slim build, black hair, and the

record bears a notation, "this man did murder one JAMES WHITE (C), at 297 Erskine, 5/15/42, with a knife and then gave up to the officers stating that he committed the crime". Disposition of that arrest is not shown. In view of the similarity in names, age and descriptive data, it would appear that this individual is identical to the subject.

8.. Interview should disclose whether or not subject was approached for recruitment by the Soviets. Interview also could result in obtaining pertinent information concerning the other persons who reportedly accompanied the subject to the USSR.

9. At the outset, subject would be advised of the interviewing Agents identities and the FBI interest and jurisdiction in the internal security field. His cooperation would then be requested in furnishing the FBI pertinent information which resulted from his travel in the USSR. This interview will be handled by two Agents experienced in security matters and will be handled in accordance with existing Bureau instructions relating to security interviews. The interview will also be handled in such a manner that Bureau sources will not be disclosed. Results of this interview will be furnished in form suitable for dissemination together with recommendations for further action.

On September 6, 1966, it was determined that voters records for Wayne County, maintained at the City-County Building, Detroit, Michigan, disclosed that Dudley Randall, born January 14, 1914, first registered to vote in Wayne County on October 7, 1957, while residing at 3407 Longfellow Street. His most recent registration to vote was on February 28, 1964, and his address at that time was furnished as 12651 Old Mill Place.

Re Detroit letter, 9/13/66, requesting Bureau authority to interview subject; and Bureau letter, 10/7/66, instructing that (1) determination be made as to whether subject is identical with an individual of the same name who admitted committing murder in 1942, and (2) ascertain fully subject's role as a poet and editor and his connection, if any, with news media.

The following investigation disclosed that subject, who was born 1/14/14, is identical to the DUDLEY F. RANDALL who was arrested in 1942 on a charge of murder. This investigation also shows that subject is employed full time as a librarian, and no information is available to indicate he has any connection with news media, and at most, he is a free-lance writer who is not widely known.

On 10/20/66, IC [redacted] rechecked records of the Detroit, Michigan, Police Department under police department #67013, and determined that DUDLEY F. RANDALL, 530 Josephine, age 28, was arrested 5/16/42, on a charge of murder. That record showed that under date of sentence the following is recorded: "dismissed no case 5/19/42."

On 10/25/66, SA [redacted] reviewed voters records for Wayne County at the City-County Building, Detroit. The Inactive Section contains a record of DUDLEY RANDALL, whose mother is identified as ADA BRADLEY, having first registered to vote 7/15/35. That record shows that when he registered to vote on 7/7/42, he lived at 530 Josephine. After the 1948 registration, he was cancelled
ADA BRADLEY

On January 5, 1967, Mr. DUDLEY FELKER RANDALL, 12651 Old Mill Place, Detroit, Mich., furnished the following information to Special Agents of the FBI:

He is employed as a librarian, Wayne County Public Library, 33030 Van Born Road, Wayne, Mich., and in addition he writes poetry, short stories, articles and book reviews for the "Negro Digest." About one year ago he formed his own company called Broadside Press which to date has been devoted to periodically publishing one sheet under the title of "Broadside" which has contained one poem. He sells these to individuals and libraries through the U. S. Mail.

In April 1966 RANDALL met [redacted], at the Writers Conference held at Fisk University, Nashville, Tenn. At that time he learned from [redacted] that [redacted] a Negro cultural group to visit the U.S.S.R. during the summer of 1966 and at that time voiced to her his desire to also visit the U.S.S.R. He requested that during [redacted] visit to the U.S.S.R. [redacted]

[redacted] Sometime after this meeting with [redacted] one of the persons originally scheduled to accompany the Negro cultural group to the U.S.S.R. cancelled out and RANDALL was invited to accompany the cultural group. The group consisted of eight persons including [redacted] In addition [redacted] also traveled to the U.S.S.R. at the same time. Travel arrangements for the group were made [redacted] and the group departed New York City on July 29, 1966, and returned to the United States about one month later.

Their first stop was at Paris, France, and they remained there for several days awaiting receipt of their Soviet visa, the group having left the United States before receipt of their visas.

On arrival at Moscow, U.S.S.R., the group was met by a Soviet official whose name RANDALL did not recall. RANDALL understood [redacted] [redacted] then on vacation in the U.S.S.R. This individual accompanied the

[redacted] They visited art galleries, painters studios and general points of interest in Moscow, Leningrad and Alma Ata as well as similar places of interest in Prague, Czechoslovakia, during their stopover in Prague on their return trip to the United States.

RANDALL's principal interest in going to the U.S.S.R. was to meet the two Soviet poets, [redacted] and [redacted] but he was not successful in meeting either of these two individuals. During his stay in Moscow he met and talked with [redacted] whom he stated is [redacted]

RANDALL requested [redacted] a book dealing with the African and/or Negro in the U.S.S.R. and after his return to the United States he received this book. [redacted]

[redacted] He also requested [redacted] to obtain and send to him a collection of poems written by any good Soviet poet, and after RANDALL's return to the United States he received a book of poems from the Institute of Soviet-American Relations, Moscow, U.S.S.R. RANDALL assumed this book was sent to him by [redacted] and as a token of appreciation he sent to [redacted] a copy of [redacted] Selected Poems.

RANDALL stated during his travel in the U.S.S.R. and his three or four day stop over in Prague, no one attempted to compromise him or to solicit his cooperation and no one made any unusual request of him, and he said he

has no knowledge that any of the other members of this group had any difficulty with the Soviet or Czechoslovakian authorities. Since his return to the United States no representative of the U.S.S.R. or Soviet Bloc country has contacted him and he stated that in the event anyone from those countries should contact him he would immediately advise the FBI.

RANDALL recalled that during the tour his group engaged in discussions with several Soviet groups and invariably the discussion centered around the United States involvement in Vietnam and the civil rights situation in the United States. He stated during those discussions it was obvious that the Soviet's position concerning Vietnam is that the United States is the aggressor in Vietnam and its involvement is contrary to the Geneva Agreement. RANDALL said that since he was not familiar with the Geneva Agreement, he did not take part in the discussion. He stated on the question of civil rights in the United States he voiced his opinion that the gains achieved in the United States by the Negro were due primarily to the efforts and initiative of the Negroes themselves and not to any legislation which has been passed in that area.
