LLOYD BROWN, District Organizer of Western Pennsylvania, is a veteran of the Y.C.L. In August, when the swell drive began, Subject went down to Pittsburgh as the representative of the National Committee of the League. Subject has been in the Y.C.L. longer than any other Negro member. He joined in 1929, in his native town of St. Paul, Minnesota, worked in New Haven, Youngstown, Cleveland, and New York; was also the first district organizer of New Jersey and one of a long list of editors of the Young Workers.

From this investigation, it is reasonable to believe that LLOYD LOUIS BROWN is presently residing at 3047 Centre Avenue, Pittsburgh, Pa. (1)

MEMORANDUM FOR

I refer to memorandum to me dated June 28, 1943, which reviews the history, development, and meaning of the Special Case work and of the danger classifications that were made as a part of that work.

After full re-consideration of these individual danger classifications, I am satisfied that they serve no useful purpose. The detention of alien enemies is being dealt with under the procedures established by the Alien Enemy Control Unit. The Special Case procedure has been found to be valueless and is not used in that connection. There is no statutory authorization or other present justification for keeping a "custodial detention" list of citizens. The Department fulfills its proper functions by investigating the activities of persons who may have violated the law. It is not aided in this work by classifying persons as to dangerousness.

Apart from these general considerations, it is now clear to me that this classification system is inherently unreliable. The evidence used for the purpose of making the classifications was inadequate; the standards applied to the evidence for the purpose of making the classifications were defective; and finally, the notion that it is possible to make a valid determination as to how dangerous a person is in the abstract and without reference to time, environment, and other relevant circumstances, is impractical, unwise, and dangerous.

For the foregoing reasons I am satisified that the adoption of this classification system was a mistake that should be rectified for the future. Accordingly, I direct that the classifications heretofore made should not be regarded as classifications of dangerousness or as a

determination of fact in any sense. In the future, they should not be used for any purpose whatsoever. Questions raised as to the status or activities of a particular person should be disposed of by consideration of all available information, but without reference to any classification heretofore made.

A copy of this memorandum should be placed in the file of each person who has hitherto been given a classification. In addition, each card upon which a classification appears should be stamped with the following language:

"THIS CLASSIFICATION IS UNRELIABLE. IT IS HEREBY CANCELLED, AND SHOULD NOT BE USED AS A DETERMINATION OF DANGEROUSNESS OR OF ANY OTHER FACT. (SEE MEMORANDUM OF JULY 16, 1943 FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO HUGH B. COX AND J. EDGAR HOOVER)."



SA observed from a discreet distance. When approached, BROWN acknowledge his identity and appeared somewhat startled when the identity of the interviewing Agent was revealed. Following a brief preliminary conversation BROWN relaxed and smiling broading tated that he had no desire whatsoever to discuss any matter with the FBI. Further attempts to engage him in conversation, as he continued walking toward his place of employment, were unsuccessful. Because a light rain had started to fall it was suggested that he pause under a hotel marquee. BROWN refused. interview was terminated. (U) Although BROWN was not unfriendly or hostile he nevertheless gave no indication that he might cooperate with the Bureau. Therefore, no recontact is anticipated at this time. The results of this interview will be included in the next annual report. 

Subject's first known association with the Communist party, according to the files of the Pittsburgh Field Division is a notation in confidential source No. quoting an article in the "Daily Worker" on October 3, 1933, wherein describing an anti-war Congress held by the Communist party in St. Nicholas Arena, New York City, there is as follows: (U)

"Lloyd Brown of the Young Communist League electrified the nearly 3000 delegates and 2000 spectators by his declaration that the militant youth of America will follow the path of the heroic Communist Party leader of youth, KARL LIEBKNECHT, in unyielding struggle against the war makers. BROWN was one of three youth speakers."

In the 1937 yearbook of the Young Communist League, subject was listed as the district organizer for the Western District of Pennsylvania, and following is an article describing the subject in that periodical. (U)

"LIOYD BROWN, District Organizer of Western Pennsylvania, is a veteran Y.C.L. 'er. In August, when the steel drive began, LIOYD went down to Pittsburgh as the representative of the National Committee of the League. LIOYD has been in the YCL longer than any other Negro member. He joined in 1929, in his native town of St. Paul, Minnesota, worked in New Haven, Youngstown, Cleveland, and New York; was also the first district organizer of New Jersey and one of a long list of editors of the "Young Worker".

"LLOYD has left many good friends in the various places in which he has worked. His favorite pastime is dancing and it is rumored that he can shake a mean hoof on the dance floor, lays claim to being a shark at shooting pool, a claim hotly disputed in many and divers quarters. proudest possession is the watch the New York Y.C.L. ers presented him as a ferewell gift." According to confidential source of information No. leaders of the Communist Party of Western Pennsylvania were in a group known as the "District Committee". Subject was a member of this committee in 1777. source indicates that he previously had been a member of the Speaker's Committee now in the files of since 1938. During this period, according to b7D the Pittsburgh office, which was found in b2 In a dated February 2, 1941, the subject is described as a figure in the party, and confidential informants and whose identity is known to the Bureau, ad b7C and whose identity is known to the Bureau, advised b7D that early in 1941, the subject was a member of the Communist Party. (U) Prior to the election of 1940, the Communist nominating petition was circulated in the Pittsburgh area to secure the signatures necessary to place the party candidates on the ballot. According to the testimony at his trial, the subject in June, 1940, circulated petitions of the Communist party falsely reporting to prosperous figures that they were petitions of the Democratic Party. Because of this he was indicted in the June term of the Grand Jury, under indictment #519, charging conspiracy, and indictments #596 and #597 charging perjury. After the trial on August 30, 1940, the subject was found guilty, and after a motion for a new trial had been refused, on March 18, 1941, he was sentenced on each of the perjury charges, the sentence to run concurrently, to serve four months in Allegheny County Jail and to pay a fine of \$200 on the conspiracy charge. The subject served his term and paid his fine. (W) In an article appearing in the Pittsburgh Sun Telegraph on April 21, 1941, the subject was described as instructing his seventeen fellow Communist party members, who were in the Allegheny County Jail with him, serving sentences which were similar to that of the subject, in American history and English.(W) b7D



Peoples Voice for April 13, 1946, page 5, column 3, carried a photograph of LLOYD BROWN with a caption saying that he had assumed a position of managing editor of NEW MASSES magazine; that he served for three years as an Army Air Force Sergeant, and prior to his Army service he was correspondent for the Labor Press, and an organizer for the United Hotel Workers of America, CIO. Peoples Voice is a Negro publication in New York City. It appears that LLOYD BROWN is not located in New York City.

For the information of the Bureau and Pittsburgh, the NEW MASSES magazine recently underwent a re-organization with considerable shuffling of personnel. LLOYD BROWN appears to be one of the new members of the magazine's personnel (U)

Since Pittsburgh appears to be the office of origin in this case, it is requested that the Pittsburgh Office notify the New York Office of any forwarding residence address that they may have for BROWN, or any information which will assist this office in ascertaining his present residence address. It was announced that LLOYD LOUIS BROWN had been appointed as a new editor to the staff of New Masses. (U)

In the daily worker of April 9, 1946, there appeared a half page advertisement announcing that 300 Communist Party clubs would hold a special meeting that week.
