

### NOTE ON YELLOW:

Subject is wife of William L. Patterson chairman New York District CPUSA. She is apparently b7C going to visit who is attending school in the USSR. Subject was a member or official of numerous Communist Party (CP) fronts between the early 1930's and 1955. In 1947 she was Vice-President of the IWO. She attended the 40th anniversary celebration of the CPUSA in 1959 and attended the 1-21-61 session of the National Committee meeting of the CPUSA. As of April, 1961, she was assigned to the Sixth AD Club of the Kings County CP. There has been located no evidence of CP membership subsequent to 10-20-61, the date the passport sanction of the ISA-50 became effective. Subject's name is included in SI and a current report is in preparation. Copies of all pertinent reports have been furnished State and CIA.

This letter is classified "Confidential" since its enclosure is so classified. The memorandum enclosed has been classified "Confidential" because it contains information furnished by a b2 valuable current source, the disclosure of which would seriously impair the Bureau's coverage in the security field.



PATTERSON'S Passport File further reflected that as of June 6, 1932, she was issued a Passport, Number 516630, for travel to Germany. The Passport was issued under the name LOUISE THOMPSON, and that the purpose of the trip was to study. She indicated that she would return to the United States in two years.

PATTERSON's Passport File also reflects that she was issued a Passport, Number 468381, on August 5, 1937, under the name LOUISE THOMPSON. At this time, the subject advised that the Passport was desired for travel to France, England and Spain.

EDWARD E. STRONG MEMORIAL EDUCATIONAL TRUST FUND

On April 19, 1957, a confidential source advised that on that date he observed a telegram addressed to Room 710, 250 South Broad Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, headquarters of the Communist Party (CP) of Eastern Pennsylvania and Delaware. The telegram announced the death of comrade EDWARD E. STRONG on April 10, 1957. It also urged that expressions of sympathy should take the form of generous contributions to a Memorial Educational Fund for the education and care of STRONG's children. The telegram was signed by "The National Committee, CP, USA".

The CP, USA has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On September 17, 1957, another confidential source made available a four page pamphlet announcing the establishment of the EDWARD E. STRONG Memorial Educational Trust Fund. The pamphlet reflects that in "1949, EDWARD STRONG assumed the post of Chairman of the CP of Eastern Pennsylvania. He became a member of the National Committee of the CP and served that organization in various capacities until his death."

The pamphlet reflects the trustees of the Fund are HERBERT APTHEKER and Dr. W. ALPHAEUS HUNTON.

On July 14, 1954, HERBERT APTHEKER testified in a Smith Act case in the U.S. District Court, Eastern District of Penngylvania, that he was, at that time, a CP member and that he had been a member since 1939.

On June 20, 1950, another confidential source advised that he knew ALPHAEUS HUNTON as a concealed CP member as late as 1945 and that HUNTON revealed himself as a thorough Communist.

The address for the fund account is the home address of APTHEKER, 32 Ludlam Place, Brooklyn, New York. The above source advised in April, 1959, that the Fund remains at the same location with the same Trustees.



A confidential source recently advised that Louise Patterson had been granted permission by the Communist Party, b7C USA, to go to the Soviet Union to visit who resides in that country. Patterson will leave the United States on July 1, 1962, for the Soviet Union. Patterson, at the time of her departure, will be traveling on United States Passport number 1822449.

#### Background:

Louise Patterson is the wife of William L. Patterson, Chairman of the New York District, CP, USA. She was born September 9, 1901, in Chicago, Illinois, and attended the University of California at Berkeley, California. Patterson visited Russia in 1932 or 1933, and toured Loyalist Spain in 1937. Patterson was a member of the Central Committee of District Number 8, CP, USA, in 1945, and a member of the Harlem Region, New York County CP as of June, 1955. Between the early 1930's and 1955 she was active as a member and/or official of numerous CP front groups. In 1947, she was elected Vice-President of the International Workers Order, an organization designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450, and was active in that organization until its dissolution in 1954. In May, 1958, she was Chairman of an affair to raise funds for the children of a deceased CP functionary. Patterson was in attendance at the 40th Anniversary celebration of the CP, USA, in 1959. Patterson traveled to the Soviet Union in 1960. She was in attendance at the January 21, 1961, session of a three-day National Committee meeting of the CP, USA. Patterson was assigned to the 6th A.D. Club of the Kings County CP in April, 1961.

Louise Patterson is described as a Negro female, 61 years of age, five feet two inches, 130 pounds, black graying hair, and brown eyes.


