ARROWHEAD LODGE, also known as: Arrowhead Camp

Arrowhead Iodge, also known as Arrowhead Camp, is located at Ellenville, New York.

The summer session catalog of the Jefferson School of Social Science (JSSS) for the periods July-August, 1944 and July-August, 1947, reflected that the JSSS held a summer vacation camp at Arrowhead Lodge during the above mentioned periods.

Party (CP) advised on March 9, 1952, that Arrowhead Iodge, also known as Arrowhead Camp, was generally known prior to 1950, in CP circles, as a place which was acceptable to the CP as a summer vacation spot for its members.

A confidential informant, who was in a position to furnish some information regarding the Arrowhead Lodge, advised on January 12, 1953, that the Arrowhead Lodge received the New York Harlem edition of "The Worker" and the "Daily Worker" for a number of years. The informant recalled that about four or five years prior to 1953, Arrowhead Lodge received mail regularly from the JSSS but that he had not observed any mail addressed to Arrowhead Lodge from the Jefferson School for the past four or five years.

The informant further advised that he had heard comments in 1947 and 1948 to the effect that Arrowhead Lodge was a Communist camp, but since then he has heard nothing indicating that the Lodge is being used as a Communist camp.

Another confidential informant, who was in a position to furnish some information regarding the Arrowhead Lodge, advised on May 18, 1955, that the Lodge does not presently receive copies of the "Daily Worker" or "The Worker." The informant stated he could furnish no information to the effect that Arrowhead Lodge was still being used by the Communists.

The JSSS and the CP have both been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

"The Worker" is the Sunday edition of the "Daily Worker," an east coast Communist daily newspaper.


