
Activities of Subject in DuSable Lodge #751, IWO, and Other IWO Groups

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

RE: WILLIAM PATTERSON LOUISE T PATTERSON

In connection with the investigation of the Communist Party, U.S.A. by this Bureau, it is deemed advisable that a technical surveillance be established on the residence of the above-named individuals, 601 East 36th Street, Chicago, Illinois, Apartment 308, telephone Drexel 7768.

William L. Patterson, Negro, and his wife, Louise Patterson, have been active in connection with Communist Party activities throughout the country for a number of years. Patterson has long been a leader of the Communist Party in the Chicago area. He is reportedly a member of the National Committee of the Communist Party. He is also a member of the Executive Committee of the Illinois-Indiana District Bureau. He is the Vice-President of the International Labor Defense in the Chicago area. He was a member of the Sacco-Vanzetti National League and was extremely active in connection with the defense of the Scottsboro case. He is a Director of the National Negro Congress and a sponsor of the Abraham Lincoln Rehabilitation Fund, Inc. Patterson was Vice-President of the League for Struggle for Negro Rights in 1935. He was on the Mooney Council for Action and a member of the National Committee of the Friends of the Soviet Union. In 1938 he was a member of the Reorganizing Committee of the American League for Peace and Democracy. He was a delegate to the National Convention of the Communist Party in New York City in 1940. Until recent date he was an instructor and director of the Chicago Workers School, which is definitely a Communist sponsored school. He was the Communist Party candidate for the Mayor of New York City in 1933, and in 1940 he was a Communist Party candidate In 1942 he was carried on the for the United States Congress. Communist Party nominating petition as a candidate for superintendent of Public Institutions in the State of Illinois. At the present time Patterson is an Assistant Director of the Abraham Lincoln School, a trade union group which is presently active in Chicago, Illinois. Information received to date tends to reflect that this school is also a Communist sponsored institution.

Patterson has always been interested in the Negro situation in and around Chicago, particularly in so far as the Communist infiltration thereof is concerned. Is is known from other technical sources that he is still interested in these matters and that he formulates considerable Party policy in so far as the same is concerned.

Louise Patterson is also known to be prominent in connection with Communist Party activities in and around Chicago. She, too, has been reported to be a member of the National Committee of the Party. She is also a member of the District Committee of the Communist Party for District No. 8. She is presently President of the Midwest District of the International Workers Order a recognized Communist Party organization. She has been extremely active in connection with such movements and organizations as the American Peace Mobilization, the Committee for peoples Rights, the Committee for Defense of Political Prisoners, the Illinois peoples Conference for Legislative Action, the International Labor Defense, the Midwestern Federation for Constitutional Liberties, the League for Struggle for Negro Rights and was active in connection with the Scottsboro defense. She was at one time an Instructor in the Chicago Workers School, which as stated above, was a Communist sponsored school. She like her husband is also extremely interested and active in connection with Negro activities in the Chicago area.

Technical coverage of the residence of the above individuals will most likely make available considerable information of an enlightening nature, especially in so far as Communist activities among the Negroes is concerned. However, it is also felt that this coverage will furnish considerable information of a political nature concerning Party activities in the Chicago area.

I recommend that this surveillance be authorized.
