a meeting of the Communist Party leaders, constituting the Communist fraction of the proposed Congress, was held to formulate plans to assure Communist control of the National Negro Congress. ________ referred to this meeting as a Communist caucus and said it was a closed meeting and that only leading Negro Communists attended.

advised that the idea of a national Negro congress was originally developed as a part of the "Popular front" policy originating at the seventh world congress in Moscow. The proposal for a national Negro congress had been approved by the National Committee of the Communist Party prior to the Howard University convention.

said that to the best of his recollection, E. FRANKLIN FRAZIER, then a professor at Howard University, was present at this meeting. stated that if he was present, as he believes, it would indicate that FRAZIER was a member of the Communist Party inasmuch as only Communist Party members were allowed at the meeting. stated that he had no further information on E. FRANKLIN TRAZIER and declined to furnish a signed statement or to testify before a Hearing Board inasmuch as he is not entirely certain that FRAZIER was among those present.

NY 138-1583 stated that after this incident, he did not feel that the employee was trustworthy and had very few dealings with him thereafter. advised that he was not associated with the employee during the 1940's. He stated that in January, 1951, Dr. FRAZIER, in his capacity as Chairman of the sponsoring committee, sent him an invitation to a testimonial dinner for W.E. DuBOIS, mentioned in previous report, whichdeclined. The informant stated that during the 1930's when he had known him, the employee did not seem to be actively interested in Communism or Marxism, but that he understood that during the 1940's, the employee had become quite a joiner and supporter of Communist front organizations. stated that he had heard that FRAZIER was a member of the Council on African Affairs, but did not know how active he was in the affairs of that organization. He stated that he did not recall whether Dr. FRAZIER had been a member of the Teachers Union at Howard University or had participated in factional disputes between the Communist and non-Communist members of the Howard University chapter of the Teachers Union. b2 b7D also advised that he, _ had been a member of the National Negro Congress, previously mentioned, which had its origin in the 1935 conference at Howard University and its first national convention at Chicago in 1936. stated that he was present at both of these meetings, but could not recall if the employee had participated in either meeting or if the employee had ever been a member of the National Negro Congress. stated that his close association with Dr. FRAZIER had ended prior to 1940, but that from Dr. FRAZIER's activities, of which he has since heard, he would say that Dr. FRAZIER has the reputation as a fellow traveler and supporter of the Communist causes. He said he had no information that FRAZIER had been a member of the Communist Party. advised that Dr. FRAZIER was considered an excellent Sociologist but was not otherwise highly regarded by his fellow faculty members as he was rather rough, without polish, and believed to consider his own interests above all others. He stated the employee's wife is not in any way interested in any type of ideological activity so far as he knew. stated he did not recall any particular degree of association between Dr. FRAZIER and other individuals on the Howard University faculty who were generally assumed to be Communist. declined to furnish a signed statement or to appear before a Hearing Board at the present time.

NY 138-1583 previously mentioned, advised that he had first met the employee during World War I. He said that his opinion of the employee at that time was that he was "personally ambitious and self assertive", and he has had no reason to revise this opinion. advised that Dr. FRAZIER was for some years a member of the Council on African Affairs, previously mentioned. He stated that in 1948 a factional fight, based mainly on the issue of Communism, developed in the organization. This divergence of opinion resulted in the ousting of MAX YERGAN and his replacement by FAUL ROBESON, the present director. stated that he understood that YERGAN had requested the assistance of Dr. FRAZIER as a Board member against ROBESON and his Communist clique, but that FRAZIER had refused to help YERGAN and seemed to favor the Communist group. stated he did not know whether this was based on Dr. FRAZIER's ideological viewpoints or because of some personal animosity toward MERGAN. b2 advised that around 1946 or 1947, he had b7D heard FAEDERICK VANDERBILT TELD, who was active in the formation of a Democratic Far Eastern policy, previously mentioned, suggest the name of E. FRANKLIN FRAZIER as a potential member of that organization. that he had heard that FRAZIER did later become a member. Concerning FREDERICK VANDERBILT FIELD, previously mentioned, advised in 1947 that FREDERICK VANDERBILT FIELD was a member of the newly formed foreign affairs committee of the Communist Party. also advised that FREDERICK V. FIELD and ALEXANDER TRACHTEMBERG were considering offering the employee an appointment to the Board of Trustees of the Jefferson School of Social Science, New York, New York, sometime in the late 1940's, but he did not know what action, if any, had been taken on this proposal. of known reliability, advised in 1947 that ALEXANDER TRACHTENBERG was a member of the National Review Committee of the Communist Party. ALEXANDER TRACHTENBERG is one of the Communist Party leaders convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on January 21, 1953 for violation of the Smith Act. The Attorney General of the United States has declared the Jefferson School of Social Science, New York City, to be within the purview of Executive Order 10450.

NY 138-1583 advised that he had no information that the employee was ever a member of the National Megro Congress. _____ in conclusion, advised that he is doubtful of the employee in terms of security and loyalty to the United States because of his questionable connections and affiliations. He stated that he could not say of his own knowledge that the employee was ever a member of the Communist Party. He said that it may be that the employee had been unwittingly victimized by the Communist Party and its members who had taken advantage of his personal ambition b2 to control and use him to the advantage of the Communist Party. b7D declined to furnish a signed statement or to appear before a Hearing Board. of known reliability, a former member of the Communist Party, advised that she did not know the employee and could rurnish no information concerning him.



There is set forth below a list of United Nations loyalty cases supervised in the Employees Security Section which are pending in your office and which have a Bureau deadline on or before August 20, 1953. As you know, these investigations were based on disloyal allegations and it is apparent that their early completion is necessary to preclude possible criticism of the Bureau.

These cases are being brought to your attention to insure that they are being closely followed. The Bureau is holding you personally responsible for their immediate completion.

As you will note, many of these cases are over sixty days old and must receive preferred attention.

To assist you in properly following these investigations to early completion, the date the investigation was opened is being set forth in addition to the name of the subject of the investigation.
