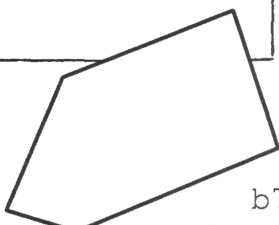

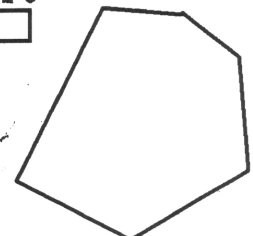

[redacted] advised on 7/10/58, that LLOYD BROWN visited the residence of BEN DAVIS in NYC, and BROWN apparently intoxicated kept shouting, "that Negro got away, he got away." (BROWN evidently referring to trip by PAUL ROBESON to Europe).

DAVIS, (apparently referring to ROBESON) stated that "The Negro from the chain gang made it. It was close though, they almost got him. If it had been left with the president, they would have gotten him and held him until they got the bill passed." (DAVIS evidently referring to proposed legislation which would restrict foreign travel in view of Communist affiliation.) (u)

Later in the conversation after more drinking, BROWN said to DAVIS "let them pass the law now." DAVIS stated that "if they passed the law, they can only get you and me." (u)

A review of recent investigative reports in Brown's file reflects that much of the data being obtained concerning subject's Communist Party activities is obtained from inadmissible sources. Further, the best admissible evidence obtained has come from highly valuable informants such as [redacted] who would probably not be released to testify except in an emergency. (u)

The Bureau desires that you conduct active investigation in this case in an effort to strengthen it by obtaining additional information relating to the subject's Communist Party activities and contacts from sources who could be called upon to testify should the need arise. (u)

In view of subject's position as a member of the Communist Party, USA, national committee this case should receive continuous investigative attention so the Bureau will be aware of the extent to which the subject is participating in Communist Party affairs. (u)

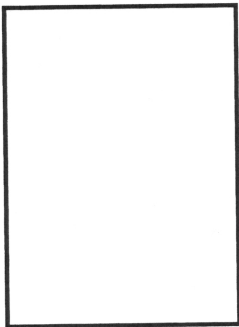

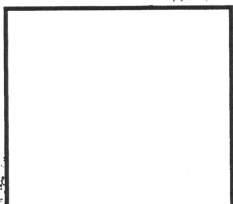

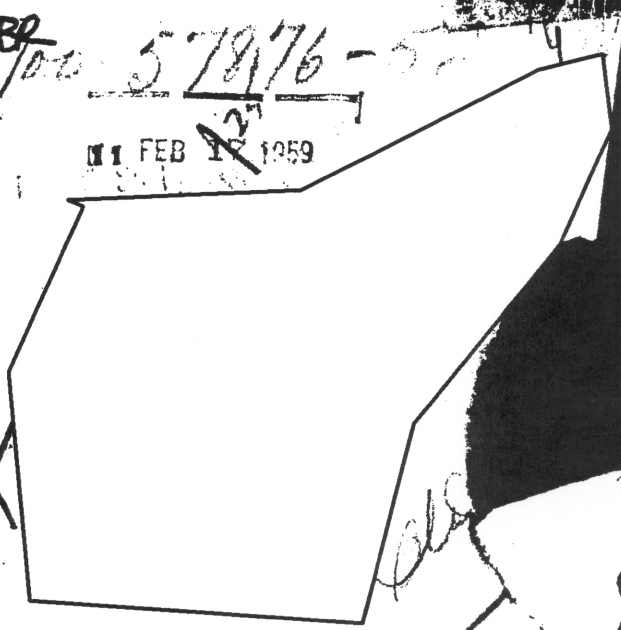
